This annual observance highlights the importance of vaccinations for people of all ages. As families prepare to send children back to school, it's a timely opportunity to check in about the health-related items on their to-do list, especially vaccinations!

Routine Childhood Vaccination

In June, the federal committee that advises on all vaccines recommended that all children 6 months and older should receive a COVID-19 vaccine. Parents can reach out to their doctor, nurse, local pharmacy, health department, or visit vaccines.gov to learn more about vaccine safety and to find availability nearby.

Monkeypox: What You Need to Know

Human-to-human transmission of monkeypox occurs through direct contact with body fluids, lesions, prolonged face-to-face contact, and indirect contact with contaminated clothing or bedding. Monkeypox symptoms are similar to smallpox symptoms but milder. Initial symptoms of monkeypox infection may include:

- Fever, headache, body aches, & fatigue
- Swollen lymph nodes
- Sore throat, nasal congestion, or cough
- A rash of lesions on the skin
