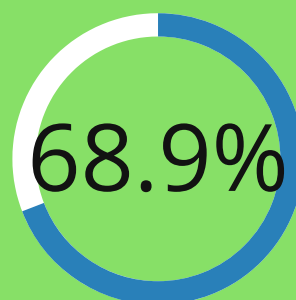

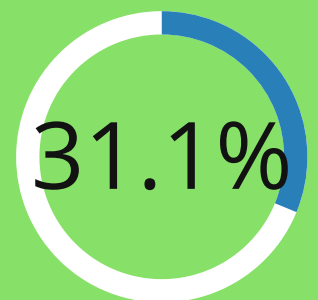
According to the Shimberg Center for Housing Studies, DeSoto County has a shortage of **5,028** needed affordable housing units.
