



Glades County Vaccine-Preventable Disease Surveillance



In 2019, the percentage of Flu vaccinations was 41% compared to Florida at 45%. 4

In 2020, the age-adjusted <u>rate</u> per 100,000 population of Deaths from Influenza and Pneumonia (All) was 16.5 compared to Florida at 9.7.





In 2021, the percentage of Immunization Levels in Kindergarten was 96.7% compared to Florida at 93.3%. ³

What Are Vaccine-Preventable Diseases? 1

Vaccine Preventable Diseases (VPDs) are conditions caused by bacteria and viruses that can be prevented by vaccines. These diseases can cause long-term illness, hospitalization, and even death. Examples of VPDs are: COVID-19, Whooping Cough (Pertussis), Chickenpox (Varicella), Measles, Meningococcal disease, and Pneumococcal diseases.



What Are The Benefits of Vaccines? 1

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) defines vaccines as a preparation that is used to stimulate the body's immune response against diseases.

Vaccines help the body create protective antibodies—proteins that help fight off infections. By getting vaccinated, you can protect yourself and also avoid spreading preventable diseases to other people in your community. Unvaccinated children are at increased risk of VPD like mumps, pertussis, and varicella.




