



### Hendry County, Florida

Hendry County includes the towns of Clewiston and LaBelle. Its county seat is LaBelle. A rural county, Hendry has a population density of 35.4 people per square mile, as compared to the Florida average of 407.0 people per square mile. The cost of living in Hendry County is below the state average. In 2017, Hendry County was recognized as a Healthy Weight Community Champion. Hendry County has a primary medical care shortage for the entire county. There is a dental shortage for low income/migrant farmworker population. For the whole county, there is a mental health shortage. The climate remains steadily warm throughout the year, with a high of 76 in January (low of 50), and a high of 93 in July (low of 71).
