





Sarasota County, Florida

Sarasota County includes Sarasota, North Port, Venice, Longboat Key, and Siesta Key. Its county seat is Sarasota and its largest city, in both land mass and the population is North Port. Sarasota was named to Forbes' List of 25 Best Places to Retire in 2019. Sarasota County has been recognized by the Florida Department of Health as a Healthy Weight Community Champion for five consecutive years. The cost of living in Sarasota County is higher than the state average. Sarasota County has a primary health care shortage for their low-income populations in Venice, Sarasota, and North Port/South Venice. Sarasota County also has a dental health care shortage for their low-income populations in North Port/South Venice and Sarasota Service Area. The climate remains warm throughout the year, with a high of 75 in January (low of 49), and a high of 93 in July (low of 72).
