# COVID-19 & Substance Use

In March 2020, the COVID-19 pandemic was declared a national emergency; from that point on, researchers have observed increased substance use and drug overdoses in the United States (US). According to <u>data</u> published in November 2022 by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), "alcohol use in the United States spiked during the Covid-19 pandemic, killing more than 49,000 people in 2020". Further research is needed to understand the relationship between the COVID-19 pandemic and patterns of substance use. However, COVID-related stress and social isolation likely contribute to increased substance use and poor COVID-19 outcomes. In the US, alcohol misuse was already a public health concern, and now it can potentially complicate COVID-19 susceptibility and severity.

A 2022 "COVID-19 and substance use disorders" study states "as the pandemic has progressed, the focus has shifted from immediate management and reduction of transmission to prevention via COVID-19 vaccines. A key concern is vaccine hesitancy in those with mental health difficulties, more generally, and specifically in those with substance use disorder (SUD). Individuals with SUD have a greater risk of contracting a COVID-19 infection but are less likely to access preventative interventions such as vaccines. Addressing equitable access to vaccines and systemic and individual risk factors will be key to increasing uptake in this vulnerable group."

The Foundation for Opioid Response Efforts (FORE) & the Addiction Policy Forum (APF) launched a health equity program that aims to dismantle COVID-19 vaccine access barriers and tackle high rates of vaccine hesitancy among individuals with substance use disorder. Through this program, vaccine navigators help people with SUD find vaccination sites, identify appointment availability, and schedule appointments in their area if needed. People can access the navigators through APF's helpline, website, Connections App, and newsletter. Vaccine navigators also provide free, confidential support, evidence-based information, and connection to local addiction treatment and recovery resources to individuals who seek it.
