Focus On...

What are Social Determinants of Health?

According to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Social Determinants of Health (SDOH) are the conditions in the environments where people are **born**, **live**, **learn**, **work**, **play**, **worship**, **and age** that affect a wide range of health, functioning, and quality-of-life outcomes and risks. ²

Social Determinants account for 40% of a person's health.¹



40%

For example: "children born to parents who have not completed high school are more likely to live in an environment that poses barriers to health such as lack of safety, exposed garbage, and substandard housing. They also are less likely to have access to sidewalks, parks or playgrounds, recreation centers, or a library." ⁶ Combined these factors can have a negative impact on health.

Here are some ways different types of social determinants can relate to health in Lee County.

Health Care Access and Quality



In Lee County 12.1% of adults could not see a doctor in the past year due to cost. 3

Economic Stability



People in Lee County making \$50,000 or more are 89.3% more likely to have said their overall health was "good" to "excellent" than those making under \$25,000.3

Education Access and Quality



A person who has less than a High School education was 20% more likely to have ever been told they have a depressive disorder than a person with more than a High School education.³

Social and Community Context



21.6% of seniors (individuals 65 and older) in Lee County are living alone. This puts them at high risk for social isolation. ⁵

Social determinants of health are a major reason why people born in one part of Lee County are expected to live 17 years longer (69.7 v 87.1) than those born in other parts of the county.⁴
