According to the 2022 Florida Youth Tobacco Survey, 17.5% of Collier County Middle & High School students have ever used an electronic vapor product, which is lower compared to 21% statewide.




12.7% of High School students in Collier County reported riding in a vehicle in the past 30 days after drinking alcohol.¹
