





## **DeSoto County, Florida**

DeSoto County includes Arcadia, which is its county seat. A rural county, DeSoto has a population density of 58.2 people per square mile (0.2% of Florida's population), as compared to Florida's average of 407.0 people per square mile. In 2017, DeSoto County was recognized as a Healthy Weight Community Champion. The cost of living in DeSoto County is lower than the state average. DeSoto County has a primary care health shortage for the whole county, a dental health care shortage for their Low Income/Migrant Farmworker Population (DeSoto), and a mental health care shortage for the entire county. The climate remains warm throughout the year, with a high of 74 in January (low of 48) and a high of 92 in July (low of 71).



## **Health Planning Council of Southwest Florida**
