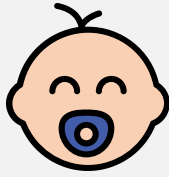

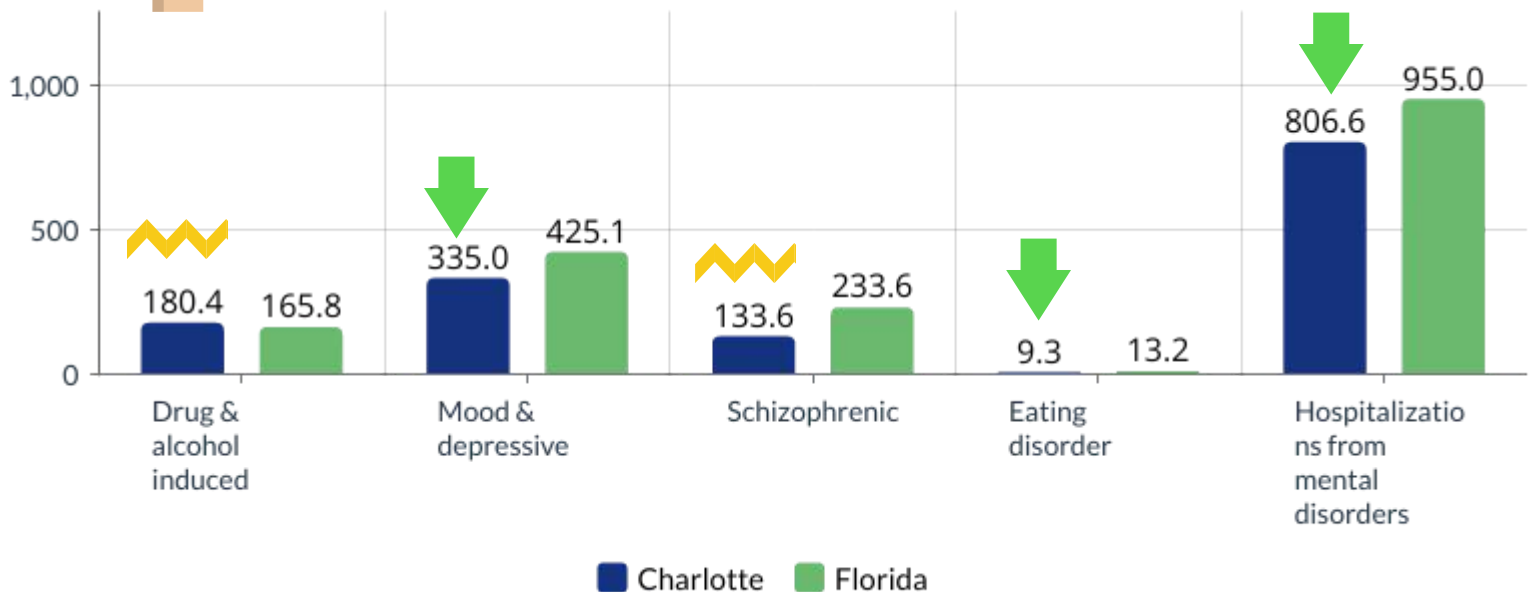

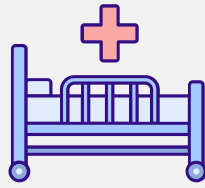

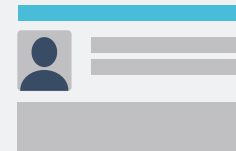

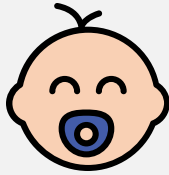

Mental Health Disorders, Rate per 100,000²



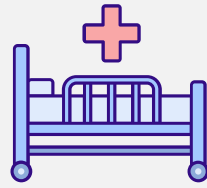

Mental Health Disorders, Rate per 100,000²



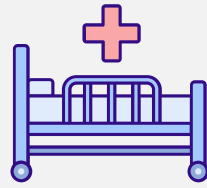

Mental Health Disorders, Rate per 100,000²



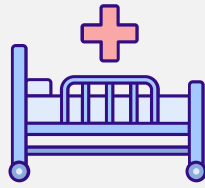

Mental Health Disorders, Rate per 100,000²



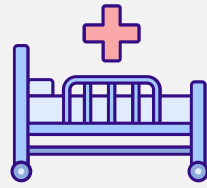

Mental Health Disorders, Rate per 100,000²



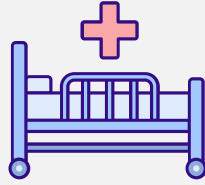
