Early Intervention

HPC's Early Intervention programs support families and caregivers to increase their child's participation in daily activities and routines that are important to the family. Services are delivered to the child and their caregivers in the natural environment and may include speech, physical therapy, and other types of services based on the needs of the child and family. HPC offers several EI programs including Early Steps, community-based playgroups, and the GAP program.

Infant Mental Health

Infant mental health is the socialemotional development, relationships, and behaviors of children from birth to 3 years old.

The Health Planning department partners with local agencies to improve the health of SWFL, particularly those who are most vulnerable. Projects include strategic planning, community health assessments, project & contract management, data collection & analysis, grant writing, meeting facilitation, community surveys & focus groups, and more.

The Southwest Florida Healthcare Coalition brings together partners across 9 counties to develop healthcare emergency preparedness response and recovery capabilities through collaboration, training, and planning.

ACA Navigator



The Navigator program provides free, unbiased, and confidential ACA health insurance assistance to consumers. It's a service that helps individuals and families navigate the complex health insurance system and provides assistance with enrolling in a health plan, understanding healthcare benefits, and accessing healthcare services.

We are the project sponsor for the Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) program. This HUDfunded program offers assistance to eligible households to increase housing stability and improve the quality of life for clients and their families.

Early Intervention Programs at HPC **Early Steps**

Florida's Early Intervention Program

Bridging the GAP

- Children not eligible for Early Steps
- Tiered level of support from playgroups, to individualized intervention

Pre-school Child Inclusion

Collaboration with Lee county school District

Alternative Augmentative Communication (AAC) Program

AAC means all of the ways that someone communicates besides talking. People of all ages can use AAC if they have trouble with speech or language skills.

Augmentative means to add to someone's speech. Alternative means to be used instead of speech.

Some people use AAC throughout their life. Some people may use AAC only for a short time like when they have surgery and can't talk.

(American Speech and Hearing Association)

- 87 children received Alternative Augmentative Communication devices (AAC) in 2023-2024
- 249 children received consultation and support specific to AAC in 2023-2024.

Target Population: Families of Children Birth to 3 with significant delays in development


Natural Environment Services where children live learn and play

Why is early intervention Important?

During the first 5 years

- it is critical children with developmental delays receive intervention as early as possible:
- A newborn's brain is only about one-quarter the size of an adult's. It grows to about 80% of adult size by 3 years of age and 90% by age 5.

HPCSWF ACA Navigators

The Affordable Care Act (ACA) introduced the Navigator role to assist individuals in enrolling in coverage through the health insurance Marketplace. Navigators are expected to remain impartial, and their services are offered at no cost.

Navigators are not licensed health insurance brokers, which means they cannot provide recommendations on specific plans or policies. Instead, they aim to empower consumers with the knowledge and resources needed to make informed decisions concerning their healthcare needs.



Navigator Services

- Unbiased information about the Health Coverage Options
- Completing Applications
- Determining Eligibility
- Improve Health Literacy
- Facilitate Enrollment in Health Plans and Medicaid

- Community Education
- **Reporting Fraud**
- Consumer Advocacy
- Help with Data-Matching Issues
- Assistance with Exemptions and Appeals



Reducing Barriers to Healthcare

- Raise awareness of subsidies and cost-sharing reductions to reduce financial barriers to care
- Conduct education activities to rural areas, provide information about eligible immigration status, and ADA compliance
- Provide technical assistance for consumers that have difficulty enrolling online, or have enrollment issues
- Assistance with determining eligibility for a Special Enrollment Period and uploading documents for Data-Matching Issues

Housing Opportunities for Person with AIDS (HOPWA)

Transitional Housing (often motels)

Clients can access 60 days of transitional housing assistance while they work with their Case Manager to obtain permanent housing.



Short Term Assistance with Rent, Mortgage and Utilities

Eligible individuals can access up to 21 weeks of housing assistance to enable them to remain in their own dwelling.



Permanent Housing Placement (often security deposits)

This service is available to allow clients to have utilities turned on or to assist with payment of rental deposits.



TBRA (Tenant Based Rental Assistance)

TBRA is a longer-term for of assistance that functions like Section 8.

Elements of an assessment may include:

- Community surveys
- Focus groups
- Community leader interviews
- MAPP Framework
- Help to meet current and future funding requirements

Program and Project Planning Assistance and Evaluation

Facilitate and guide the planning of programs or projects. We help set measurable objectives and can provide an evaluation of a project, grant, or program.

Education & Outreach

Assist with the creation of educational and outreach materials and brainstorm and execute new community programming. We host monthly documentary screenings, create topic-based fact sheets, provide public health training, and produce the annual county health profiles.






Disaster Preparedness

- Development of detailed goals and objectives with associated actions steps, measures, and owners

Tier 3

Most thorough process includes previous tiers but allows for additional elements to assist in the execution.


